Inclusive leadership	Local authorities and Francophone community leaders work together to create a welcoming and inclusive community, thus facilitating connections between newcomers and members of the welcoming community. They advocate a discourse favorable to diversity and inclusion.
Equitable access to services and activities	Newcomers have access to services and resources in French and related to the Francophone community to enable them to successfully integrate.
Economic development, entrepreneurship and employment	The welcoming community recognizes, values and take advantage of the expertise provided by French-speaking newcomers to increase the economic vitality of the region.
Commitment and civic participation	Newcomers participate in the community, civic and political activities of the welcoming Francophone community.
Welcoming public spaces	Public spaces and Francophone recreation infrastructures are accessible, facilitate social cohesion, improve the quality of life, as well as the integration of newcomers into the welcoming community.
Safe communities	The welcoming communities encourage exchanges between newcomers and authorities in order to develop a good level of trust.
Inclusive communities	Newcomers feel that their identity is respected and feel part of the welcoming Francophone community. Community members have a positive attitude towards newcomers. They trust and understand each other.
