Series of infographics – Focus on Francophone Immigration

1. Background

- The *Francophone Immigration Network of Saskatchewan (Réseau en immigration francophone de la Saskatchewan (RIF-SK))* has a consultation, collaboration and research mandate.
- In 2019, the RIF-SK coordinated an evaluation of paths to integration for Francophone newcomers in Saskatchewan 2010-2020.
- Through this project, the RIF-SK compiled statistics originating from Census 2016. This data is useful for the work performed by the Network.

2. New resource

- Five profiles were developed in order to optimise the use of this data.
- The profiles focus on information relating to permanent residents who are the clients eligible for services offered through the RIF-SK.
- The profiles focus on Francophone immigration in Gravelbourg, Moose Jaw, Prince Albert, Regina, and Saskatoon.

3. Target audience

- These profiles are meant for all the actors and partners of the RIF-SK. For this reason, they are available in French and English.

4. Uses

- Simple and easy to use, these profiles serve employees of the Network in their day to day work as it relates to Francophone immigration.
- The profiles support the improvement of service offerings to Francophone newcomers in Saskatchewan.
- The profiles contribute to improving awareness of the reality of Francophone immigration for the English-speaking majority.

The Francophone immigration network in Saskatchewan (RIF-SK) is a provincial Francophone round table. Its mandate is to facilitate the development of services and resources that foster the arrival, retention, and inclusion of Francophone immigrants in Saskatchewan. RIF-SK does not provide direct services to recent immigrants; instead, it works with community and government actors to promote Francophone immigration to Saskatchewan. It is funded by Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada (IRCC).
